SUMMER PROGRAM IN MEXICO (SPM)

THE SIP AND SPM PROGRAMS INCLUDES:

ACCOMMODATION

University's dormitories - You will be housed in a double occupancy room in one of our four residences. All of them have a secure swipe-card entry system with 24-hour security presence, wireless Internet and are ideally located for easy access to academic, sport and recreational facilities at UDLAP campus. Residences are fully furnished and equipped with laundry facilities and common areas.

Homestay (groups only) - If want to learn more about the local people, culture, and life in Mexico, or if you need to focus on your studies, you can live with a Mexican family. You will have a single room with bed linens and meals are included.



CULTURAL WORKSHOPS AND TRIPS

We provide the students the chance to combine cultural workshops and tourism activities while expanding their knowledge of Mexico's ethnic, linguistic, historical and artistic diversity. Salsa and cooking workshops give students a deeper cultural experience.

Trips include visits to museums, archeological sites, historical sites, visits and interviews with artisans and craftsmen, visits to their workshops, communities, schools, and specific interest groups.

Students will have the chance to take part in three local visits to different historical and touristic places in Mexico. There is a variety of activities during each trip and all trips include: ground transportation, guides, entrance fees and shared accommodation.
