## University of Exeter Nigeria Postgraduate Taught Scholarships 2024/25

The University of Exeter is offering scholarships worth £4,000 to international students from Nigeria enrolling on an eligible Postgraduate Taught (Masters) programme in January 2025.

These scholarships have been created to provide the opportunity for more students from this country to become part of our community of learners and develop their academic skills for the future.

These awards are available to applicants who:

- are a citizen/passport holder of Nigeria and therefore classed as an International student for fees purposes
- hold an offer to study one of the following eligible campus-based Masters programmes at the University of Exeter, Faculty of Environment, Science and Economy, commencing in January 2025:

## **Business and Management**

- MSc Business Analytics
- MSc Business and Management
- MSc International Business and Strategy
- MSc Marketing and Business Analytics

## **Data Science**

• MSc Statistical Data Science

## Engineering

- MSc Engineering Business Management
- MSc International Supply Chain Management

And will be received by those who go on to:

- meet the conditions of that offer as set out in their offer letter, including paying a deposit
- enrol on that programme in January 2025.

These awards are intended for self-funded students.

Only the programmes listed above are eligible. (Postgraduate Certificates, Postgraduate Diplomas, Degree Apprenticeships, fully online or distance learning programmes are not eligible.)

This award will be automatically allocated to eligible applicants applying by 1 December 2024 for January 2025 entry. A separate application is not required.<sup>i</sup>

This scholarship will be awarded as a reduction in tuition fees; it cannot be paid as cash or attributed to other charges such as accommodation fees. It will be automatically deducted from your first-year tuition fees following enrolment. If you choose to pay your tuition fees in instalments, the award will be deducted from the total annual tuition fee and the remaining balance split accordingly.<sup>ii</sup>

This award is for one year only and is not recurrent for subsequent years of study.

You cannot normally receive more than one scholarship from the University of Exeter; if you are eligible for multiple scholarships, you will be awarded whichever scholarship has the higher value. However, this scholarship can be received together with a University of Exeter Global Excellence Scholarship 2024/25 (£7,500 award).

If your tuition fees will be financed by an external body (such as an overseas government or Chevening, Commonwealth or a partner Institution) with whom the University has a shared financing agreement then this award may be invalidated or superseded with a different fee arrangement.

If you expect to receive funding from a charity this may also make you ineligible to receive this scholarship.

If you defer your 2024/25 offer or change fee status, then your scholarship offer will be invalidated. Awardees may be asked to provide a photograph and written or video profile for inclusion in University publicity about our scholarship schemes and scholars' study experiences.

**Note**: Applicants allocated one of these awards in Round 1 for September 2024 entry and changing entry from September 2024 to January 2025 remain eligible.
