

## University of Exeter Vietnam Global Leaders Scholarship 2024/25

The University of Exeter is offering scholarships worth £3,000 to international students from Vietnam, enrolling on an eligible Postgraduate Taught (Masters) programme in September 2024.

These scholarships aim to ensure that students from this country are represented among the University's diverse academic and cultural profile, contributing to and enriching all aspects of their chosen Masters programmes.

These awards are available to applicants who:

- are a citizen/passport holder of Vietnam and therefore classed as an International student for fees purposes; and
- hold an offer to study an eligible campus-based Masters programme at the University of Exeter commencing in September 2024.

And will be received by those who go on to:

- meet the conditions of that offer as set out in their offer letter, including paying a deposit if required; and
- enrol on that programme in 2024/25.

These awards are intended for self-funded students.

These scholarships are available for all campus-based Masters Programmes excluding the following ineligible programmes: The Exeter MBA; MRes Global Political Economy; MRes Management; MRes Economics (Pathway to PhD); MSc Human Resources Management 24 or 30 months; MSc Minerals Processing (Professional); MSc Mining Engineering (Professional); MA International Film Business; MSc Island Biodiversity and Conservation; Clinical Psychology programmes delivered by Clinical Education, Development and Research (CEDAR); Master of Public Administration (MPA) with Applied Study; Legal Practice Course (LPC); Graduate Diploma in Law (GDL); MA Law (SQE1); MA Law (Conversion); LLM Legal Practice (SQE 1&2); SQE Preparation Courses; Postgraduate Certificates; Postgraduate Diplomas; Degree Apprenticeships. Fully online or distance learning programmes are not eligible.

This award will be automatically allocated to eligible applicants applying for September 2024 entry<sup>i</sup>. A separate application is not required.<sup>ii</sup>

This scholarship will be awarded as a reduction in tuition fees; it cannot be paid as cash or attributed to other charges such as accommodation fees. It will be deducted automatically from your first-year tuition fees following enrolment. If you choose to pay your tuition fees in instalments, the award will be deducted from the total annual tuition fee and the remaining balance split accordingly.<sup>iii</sup>

This award is not recurrent for subsequent years of study.

You cannot normally receive more than one scholarship from the University of Exeter; if you are eligible for multiple scholarships, you will be awarded whichever scholarship has the higher value. However, this scholarship can be received together with a University of Exeter Global Excellence Scholarship (£7,500 award).

If your tuition fees will be financed by an external body (such as an overseas government or Chevening, Commonwealth or a partner Institution) with whom the University has a shared financing agreement then this award may be invalidated or superseded with a different fee arrangement.

If you expect to receive funding from a charity this may also make you ineligible to receive this scholarship.

If you defer your 2024/25 offer or change fee status, then your scholarship offer will be invalidated. <sup>iii</sup> Tuition fees deduction/s due are applied to your student account and show in your online statement within the first four weeks of study. Any awardees studying part time (under the relevant visa regulations) will receive the full Scholarship deduction in their first year.
