3	Update on CUA Delivery Progress
	No update report was shared ahead of the meeting as the CUA Board meeting has been postponed until
	December. Instead, a verbal update was provided on some of the headlines:
	Mission 1: Support the Sustainable and Inclusive Growth of the City
	- Interventions in the hub have continued through summer and work has now begun to capture
	longer-term impact of business support programmes.
	- Ongoing funding is being considered
	• An AHRC Creative Clusters bid is being prepared for early 2025. This will include a business
	support programme for businesses in the creative industries delivered from the Hub.
	- UoE Degree Apprenticeships team and Help to Grow Teams have regular presence at the Hub to
	promote the offer to local businesses.
	- UoE knowledge transfer teams have regular presence at the hub – promoted via social
	channels/newsletter - to increase awareness and visibility of skills development programmes
	Mission 2: Innovate towards a sustainable low-carbon economy for the City of Exeter
	- The new Net Zero Programme Manager is now in post and leading the City's decarbonisation mission.
	 A new Exeter CUA Sustainability Advisory Group has been convened, which comprises all of the
	sustainability leads for the CUA partners plus the new programme manager, as well as representation
	from DCC. This group will meet quarterly and steer this mission
	- The most tangible difference is likely to be around Transport – for example, all partners will share
	data on travel to work looking for gaps and opportunities
	- The Parliamentarians' Guide to Climate Change is being launched at the Houses of Parliament this
	evening

	Mission 3: Build a City of Aspiration and Opportunity
	- The South West Institute of Technology (SWioT) has been relicensed for another 10 years. We are
	currently updating the Data Skills Escalator and conducting a new Green Skills Escalator - these will
	help map and identify skills needs and provision in the region.
	- The Devon Education Alliance has identified 2 priorities which are being taken forward by 2 working
	groups:
	 SEMH support for educators
	 Coaching and Tutoring pilots to raise attainment.

- We are planning to deliver a series of youth-centred summits with Ted Wragg Trust next year to bring together young people, educators, service delivery organisations, alternative providers, voluntary organisations, and academics. This will be an opportunity for the YP to tell us what their priorities are

Mission 4: Support an ambitious Culture and Tourism offer

- £103k funding bid to National Lottery Heritage Fund was successful. This will expand the Heritage Volunteers (now called Exeter Heritage Champions), and to develop the Exeter Heritage Partnership into a formal entity. Co-Lab are also a partner on this programme, so we can deliver a specific strand of activity around pre-employability skills to help people back on their path into work.
- The final round of Creative Arc projects have been commissioned these are 6 varied projects, ranging from hyperlocal to more broad
- Two consultants have been commissioned to carry out a feasibility study for developing the Literary Industries here in Exeter
- The University has been invited to be part of a consortium bid led by Leicester University to the National Lottery Heritage Fund, looking at protecting and enhancing the heritage of university owned green spaces while increasing access for local communities.

Mission 5: Enhance the Health and Wellbeing of our citizens

- The University and RDUH were recently successful in their £6.8M bid for a UK Hub for One Health Systems: Creating Sustainable Health and Social Care Pathways.
 - a UK-wide hub facilitating the transition to an environmentally sustainable healthcare system by bringing together healthcare leaders, industry partners, and academics to address the challenge of decarbonising health and social care pathways
- We are continuing to support the work of the One Eastern Devon Partnership e.g. A student intern has been supporting the development of their comms strategy; an academic has joined their Health Inequalities strategy task and finish group
- We are working closely with the Devon VCSE Alliance and will be delivering some training on participatory research methods to their Research Community of Practice in the new year

Discussion

- Panel members again noted their keeness for our climate scientists to present their research to the Community, either in person or in a webinar
- The importance for prioritising tangible outcomes was stressed

Actions:

- Regional Engagement Manager to reach out to Climate Scientists to ask them to deliver research findings at a community event
 - Share information relating to risk and the use of helmets and cycling

4 Engaging Students

The Head of Student Engagement, Student Guild gave an update on Guild activities. The Guild is an independent charity which supports students by promoting welfare and providing social cultural opportunities through:

Partnership approach:

- Intiatives delivering events with partners such as Saddles and Paddles and Clip n Climb,
- Working with organisations on welcome activities e.g. city tours and coffee crawls, providing opportunties for students to learn about local companies
- Cultural and music festivals e.g. Exe Fest and providing recording opportunities to students and the public in the Phoenix sound gallery
- Working with organisations such as Devon Air Ambulance to provide e.g. CPR training and St John's ambulance working with the First Aid Society
- Wrist band deals, where students can access discounts with independent businesses
- Exeter Student Volunteers a Student Society which runs about 16 different projects offering volunteering opportunities e.g. food action, and school partnerships
- Members of the public can join societies for example, the choral society. There is a small Associate Membership fee to cover costs in addition to the subscription fee
 Support more local businesses to our students

- The Guild is happy to facilitate volunteering opportunities and conversations with individuals or organisations and can promote volunteering opportunities via the Handshake platform

Improving Diversity in Engagement

- The Guild are doing a lot of work around understanding the student body and its diversity, to help tailor opportunties for them
- They are also trying to understand what students want around skills development and mutual benefit while most students are values-driven, they are having to make options between work and volunteering
- They are trying to improve voice and representation by helping students lobby council and politicians collaboratively and removing barriers
 - For example, paying students to attend advisory boards e.g. EDI has led to a huge increase in the diversity of applicants
- They are also trying to improve cohesion, helping students to understand each other, increasing cultural competencies and helping integration and belong

Skills Development

- Committee members are given training for their roles on e.g. how to do budgeting
- Societies get a newsletter and have access to the training, but they don't always take it up
- Safeguarding ESV a lot of the opporutnities are linked to partners and the safeguarding will be delivered by the partner

Discussion

- Could we galvanise students to work with community around a specific, identified need? A group of 50 people could make a significant difference
 - Can we reduce the cost barrier to local organisations attending the Welcome Fayre?
 - Welcome Fayre is run in partnership with the university through Event Exeter which means that all external organisations including student businesses have to pay
 - Could we consider a new model where e.g. 4 or 5 charities share a spot; and/or a lottery for smaller charities?

Actions

- The Head of Student Engagement to share the link for the volunteering form and to raise awareness of volunteering opportunities
- Head of Student Engagement / Regional Engagement Manager to look at options for making the Welcome Fayre more accessible to charities and community organisations

- Panel to identify a problem / need and consider how we can bring students and community together to deliver solutions
