   ready before submitting a survey. You can access a copy of this year's report on the website to prepare
   your answers in advance. This report will then take about 10 minutes to complete.
- If you would like to download a copy of your report you can do this on the final page after you have clicked 'submit'.

- Your individual response is **fully confidential**. Examples of best practice will be championed in the 2024 results with permission from the signatory. We encourage signatories to publicly report their own data to increase transparency however this decision is up to each institution.
- EAUC will collate reporting information from all SDG accord signatories and use it to produce a global picture of the education sector's contribution to the SDGs.
