# EXETER THROUGH TO SEMI-FINALS IN A THRILLER

EXETER UNIVERSITY are through to the semi-finals of the U.A.U. soccer championships after beating Hull 8-7 on penalties in a dramatic sudden-death play-off at Gras Lawn yesterday.

The penalty competition was introduced when the game finished 2-2 after extra time.

After five spot kicks each, the score was 4-4, with Chris Read having saved one Hull effort and Paul Matsen having hit the bar for Exeter.

The penalty competition then became sudden death and the score reached 8-7 before Hull's Mark Spiers missed the target to give Exeter a place in the semi-final against Liverpool on February 8.

Earlier Charlie Hawker had been the Exeter hero, equalising in the second half of normal time after Hull had taken an early lead and then scoring a second equaliser from the penalty spot with only five minutes of extra time remaining.

# EXETER AND HULL IN U.A.U. CLASH
