Getting around Exeter



On Foot...

Both campuses are well connected by walking routes, and maps can be found on our webpage.

By Bus...

<u>4/4A</u> bus service connects the Streatham campus with Exeter St David's station, the city centre and St. Luke's campus. Runs every 10-15 mins.

<u>H</u> bus service connects the St. Luke's campus with the city centre, and both Exeter Central and Exeter St. David's railway stations

<u>UNI night bus</u> connects Streatham campus and student accommodation with the city centre. Runs on Weds, Fri and Sat nights every 30 mins from midnight-4am.

Single bus fares currently capped at £2 for almost **all** bus journeys in the UK until 31st Dec 2024.

Student <u>termly bus passes</u> are available for unlimited bus travel. £228 for one term.



Travelling in the UK by train



16-25 Railcard: £30 for one year - save one-third off train ticket prices <u>16-25railcard.co.uk</u>

Available to **all** full-time students, regardless of age. Digital railcard saved on your phone.

10% off Advance train fares with a TOTUM card on Cross Country Trains

Download the <u>Trainline app</u> for iOS and Android

Cheaper advance fares are available 12 weeks before date of travel. Sign up for ticket alerts if planning a trip on specific dates.

Travelling in the UK by coach



Slower but often cheaper than trains

Good for London and airports.

Exeter - London takes around 4.5 hours.

National Express

Young Persons Coachcard

(available to **all** full-time students) - £15 - save one-third on National Express coach fares.

Megabus 10% discount on coach fares with a TOTUM card; free wifi and charging points available on most services

<u>Flixbus</u> Cheap fares from Exeter to Plymouth, Bristol, London and beyond



Beaches of Devon



- Exmouth is half an hour away by train
- Dawlish Warren is a sandy beach and nature reserve just 15 minutes away by train
- Teignmouth is a seaside town and beach which is only 20 minutes away by train.





National Trust

- Conservation charity that cares for areas of woodland, coastline and historic buildings all over the country.
- The closest location to Exeter is Killerton which is accessible by public transport.
- If aged 18-25, you're eligible for a Young Person's membership £45.60 per year or £3.80 per month



Bristol & Bath



- Bristol is just under one hour by train from Exeter St. David's station (1 hour 15 mins to Bath Spa), or 1.5 hours by coach
- Visit Bath's Roman Baths
- <u>Bridgerton</u> filming locations in historic Bath
- Do a Bristol <u>walking tour</u> of street art including Banksy's famous work
- See amazing views from the Clifton Suspension Bridge
- Visit the <u>Bristol Aquarium</u>

London



Make sure you plan!

<u>daysoutguide.co.uk</u> – 2 for 1 entry to many London attractions (and elsewhere in the UK) if travelling by train.

Search for advance bookings and special offers, for example:

- <u>London Pass</u> A sightseeing city card
- Oyster card A pre-pay travel card for use on the Tube and London buses. Ask staff at a Tube station to load your 16-25 Railcard onto your Oyster card to save one-third off Off-Peak Tube fares

Lots of free places to visit (may need to book in advance)

Safety & security



Don't flash your cash

Be aware of pickpockets – keep BRP, passport, phone and money in separate secure places if possible. If available, leave your passport and BRP in the hotel safe





Before you travel, make a paper copy and photograph of your passport, your student card and/or your BRP and keep them separate to your travel documents
