#### The Exeter campuses

Streatham and St Lukes campuses are easy to travel to by foot and public transport.

- Streatham St Lukes campus: 20-minute bus route (UNI) between both campuses (£2 bus fare) or a 30minute walk.
- Both routes go through town- easy links to more transport (bus station) and shops.
- There are many walk routes and bus options available in the city for you to travel to and from campus that you can access from your phone and <u>Stagecoach bus app</u>.
- If you think you'll be using public buses regularly it is cheaper to buy a <u>discounted Termrider ticket</u>.

#### Streatham campus in the city

How long to travel into city (High Street) from Streatham: approx. 26-minutes walking, UNI bus £2 per journey (15-minutes).


There are plenty of bus options on the <u>University website</u>.

#### Shopping in the city – Grocery shopping

- There are many **small supermarkets** in the city centre where you can do a weekly shop, e.g. Tesco, Sainsbury's.
- **Bigger and cheaper supermarkets** require a car/bus, e.g. Aldi, Lidl, (bigger) Tesco, Morrisons. It can be cheaper if you do bigger and less frequent shops. Consider ordering a delivery service with your fellow tenants. For cheaper transport to the supermarket, consider sharing a taxi with your flatmates.
- Supermarkets normally open until 10pm (with some exceptions for smaller ones), but they close at 5pm or earlier on Sundays.
- There are varied **international shops** in the city centre. These follow their own opening schedules.

#### Shopping in the city – Clothes and homeware

- If you'll be staying in University accommodation, check what is included before buying homeware.
- Wilko is in the city centre has a lot of homeware options
- **IKEA** is only a bus ride away (Bus J or I from the city centre) and offers plenty of cheap options. Join our <u>planned trip to IKEA</u> on Thursday of Welcome Week.
- For cheap clothes and other items, check out Exeter's many charity shops (British Heart Foundation, Children's hospice, Cancer Research UK and more).
- <u>Princesshay</u> is Exeter's main shopping precinct with high street stores.
- Fore Street and Gandy Street hold many gems if you want to explore independent shops.









## Places of interest in the city

- Exeter Cathedral: 25 minutes walking from Streatham campus; 18 minutes from St Luke's campus. Free to visit for worship or if you get a Residents' card, which you can get if your postcode starts with EX1-EX4.
- **Exeter Quay**: 35 minutes walking from Streatham campus; 18 minutes from St Luke's campus. Beautiful in a sunny day.
- <u>Underground passages</u>: 23 minutes walking from Streatham campus; 16 minutes from St Luke's campus. £6 for students.
- <u>**Red Coat tours**</u> will walk you through the history of Exeter for free.



#### <u>Nightlife</u>



Exeter has many different types of venues for evening life: bars, music venues, comedy clubs, theatre, etc. Below we've listed a few student favourites.

- **Pubs and bars**: The Ship Inn, The Turks Head, Double Locks (by the river). The most popular among students are The Ram bar (on campus) and The Imperial.
- Live music: The Old Firehouse, Lemon Grove, Exeter Phoenix and others host concerts and events.
- Clubs: popular venues include Timepiece, Fever & Boutique, Cavern, etc.

Most venues should have the logos (above) somewhere. It means that if you're feeling uncomfortable or need help on a night out there are a number of different ways to get support. Our <u>Community Guide</u> has more information.
