

Serious Fraud Alert

We wanted to warn you about a recent serious scam that is targeting Chinese students at UK universities.

The student is contacted by a fraudster pretending to be from the Chinese Embassy or Chinese police. They will usually say that the student has been involved in a financial crime such as money laundering or other illegal activity.



They will say they must pay a large amount of money, or else be imprisoned or deported.

The callers are very convincing and will usually try to keep you on the phone and then on a video call for monitoring. Genuine officials would never do this, or prevent you from seeking advice.

If you are contacted in this way, do not pay or provide your bank details. Instead you should end the call and contact <u>International Student Advice</u> who can reassure you that it is a scam and advise how to report it, if you are willing to.

Don't forget, our wellbeing team is also available to help if you have worries or are upset by this. You can contact them via the wellbeing website.

The police have specific Chinese Student Fraud guidance on their website in traditional and simplified Chinese - <u>Fraud prevention advice for Chinese students</u>

Remember – the UK police, UK Visas and Immigration or banks will never ask you to transfer money or threaten you with deportation. If you receive such a call, it is not genuine.

The BRP card system is ending in December 2024 as UK Visas and Immigration (UKVI) move to an online system from 01 January 2025. If you have a BRP card but don't already have an eVisa, you will need to create an

Highlighting Devon: Flaming Tar Barrels!

For a truly unique Devon experience, head to <u>Ottery St</u> <u>Mary for the famous Tar Barrels</u> event held on Tuesday 5 November. This very unique and ancient tradition involves local residents carrying flaming tar barrels through the streets, and it's free to watch.



The West Country has a history of torchlight processions and burning barrels and Ottery was only one of the many towns and villages

following an annual tradition containing barrels which were rolled in the streets on November 5th each year. Somewhere along the line someone decided rolling was tame and carrying barrels on your shoulders was far more appealing and so the present tradition was born and now Ottery is the only Town in the country carrying full sized lighted tar barrels through the streets.

If you are lucky enough to get a coach ticket to the event then enjoy and be prepared for large crowds. We promise it will be an exhilarating experience you won't forget!
