

Employment opportunity: Exeter Student Ambassador and International Student Ambassador!

We are looking for current students, who feel positive about their course and student life at the University of Exeter and would like to share their experiences with others, to join the Exeter Student Ambassador Scheme. Student ambassadors work on a wide variety of paid jobs (e.g. promoting their subject, campus tours, open days, workshops with schools, mentoring, etc.), and are able to increase their employability and skills while doing so.



We choose our International Student Ambassador team (those that met you during the International Welcome Programme, Heathrow etc) from the Student Ambassador pool. So, if you want to work with us throughout the year, you need to be a Student Ambassador first!

Attendance Monitoring - information for visa holders

Student Visa holders must check-in to all timetabled in-person teaching sessions using the MyExeter app.

Each teaching session on your timetable in the My Day section of the app will have a green check-in button at the top right. Click this button and follow the steps to check-in successfully. You can find technical guidance to help you complete check-in using MyExeter here.

If you study Nursing or are on the BMBS programme you must complete your digital check-in using a One Time Code (OTC). This is available as a tile on the <u>iExeter app</u>. Information on how to use One Time Code check-in is available here.

A trip to remember: Ottery St Mary Tar Barrels

Each month we will recommend a local attraction or day trip to explore.

For a truly unique Devon experience, head to <u>Ottery St</u> <u>Mary for the famous Tar Barrels</u> event held on Tuesday 5 November. This very unique and ancient tradition involves local residents carrying flaming tar barrels through the streets, and it's free to watch. It's worth planning for!



The West Country has a history of torchlight processions and burning barrels and Ottery was only one of the many towns and villages following an annual tradition containing barrels which were rolled in the streets on

November 5th each year. Somewhere along the line someone decided rolling was tame and carrying barrels on your shoulders was far more appealing and so the present tradition was born and now Ottery is the only Town in the country carrying full sized lighted tar barrels through the streets.

We recommend going on an organised trip. The Students' Guild or Student Societies often have coach trips so do <u>check their web pages</u>. We promise it will be an exhilarating experience you won't forget!
