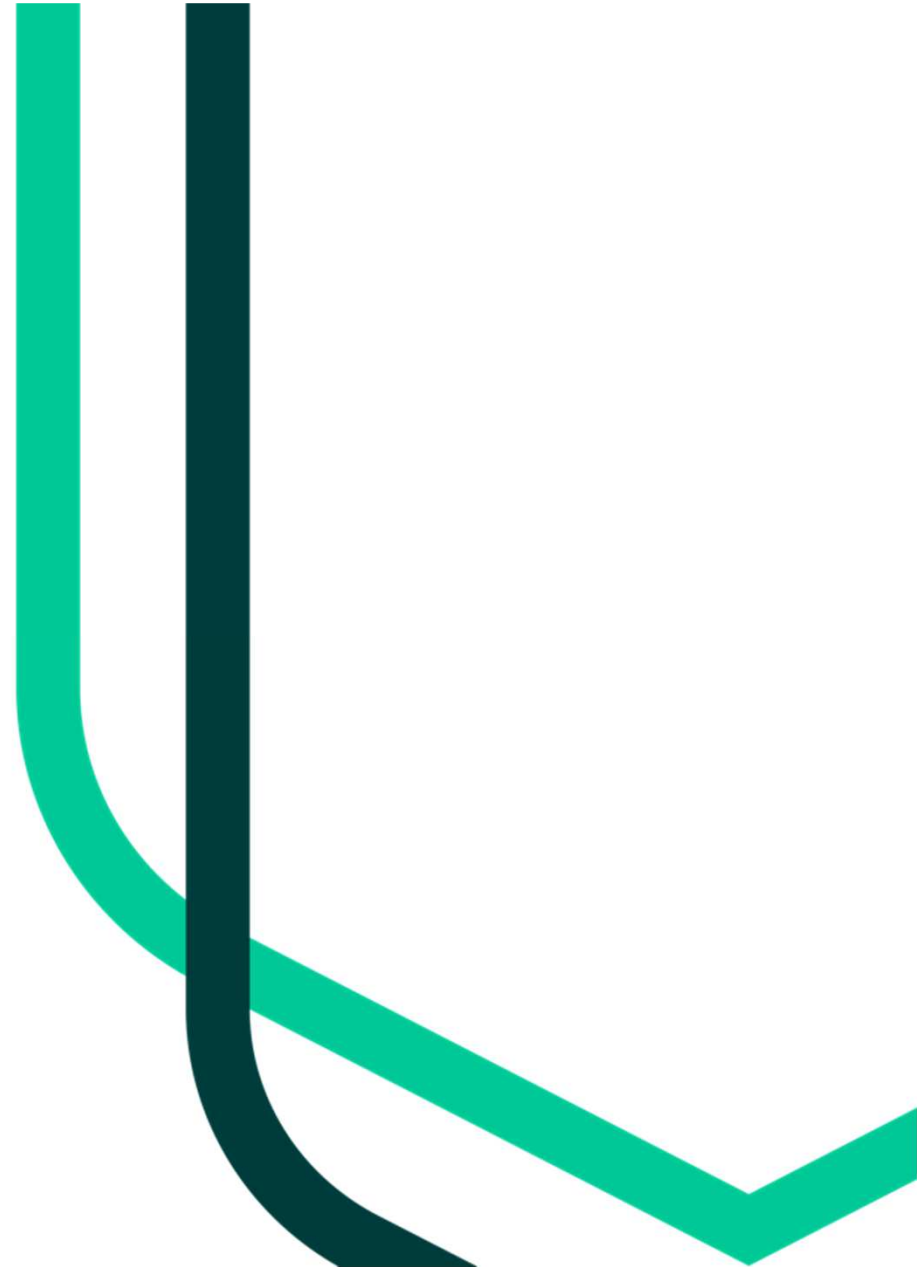

This guide is specifically designed for accessing Trent/ESS *off-campus*. If you are accessing it on-campus either on a wired connection or via Eduroam, there is no need for any action on your part.



Access to iTrent security changes.

- As part of the Essential IT Security programme roll out the University has taken the decision to increase the security controls around iTrent Employee Self-Service (ESS).
- As a result you will be now required to go through some additional security steps when accessing ESS **off campus**.
- You will now need to connect to Aruba VIA Virtual Private Network (VPN) and Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA). These steps enable additional levels of security controls and another layer of protection, keeping everyone's data secure.

Please note;

This only applies to those accessing ESS from off campus . If accessing on Campus and on either a wired connection or connected to Eduroam then you won't experience any change.

If you have already setup MFA please skip this step.

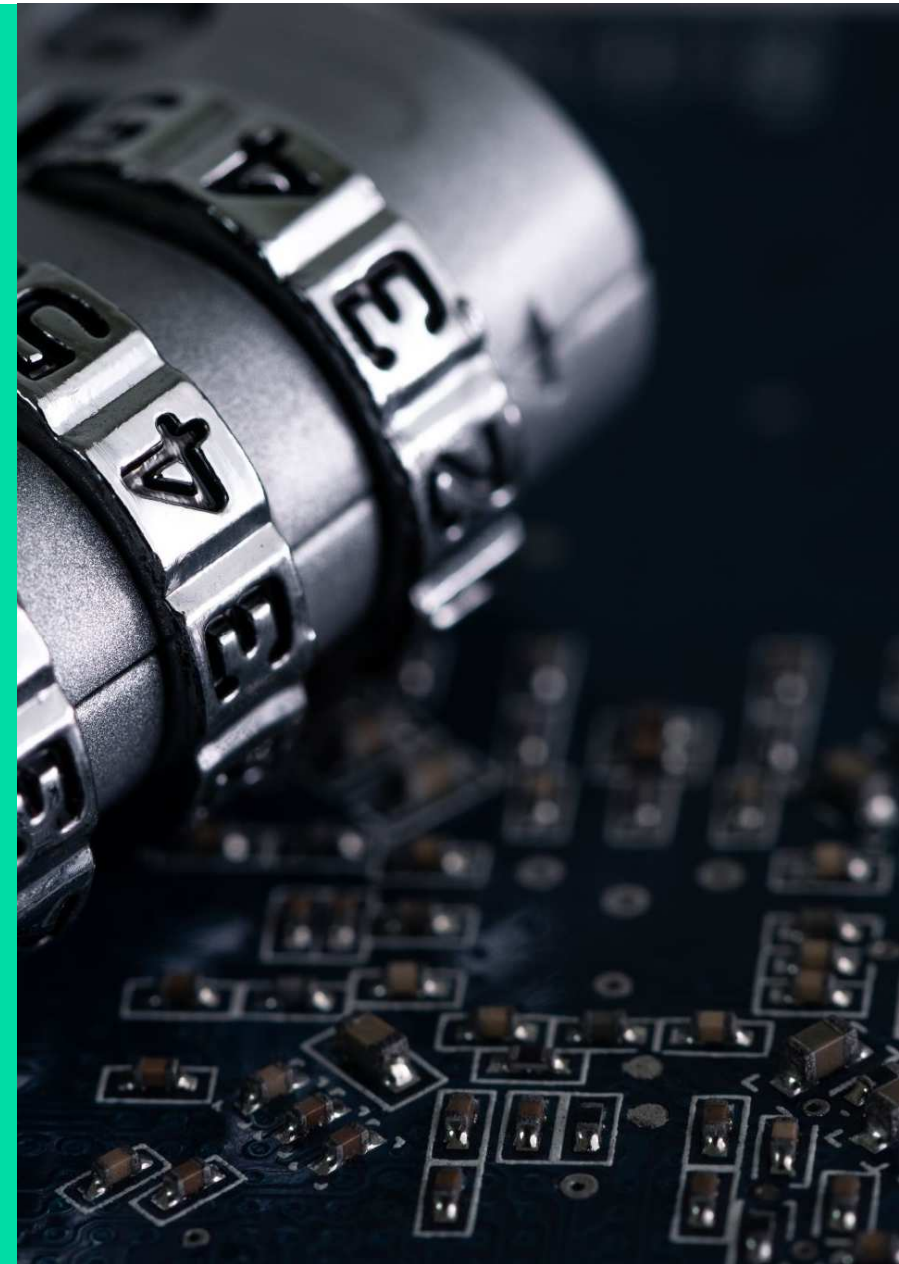

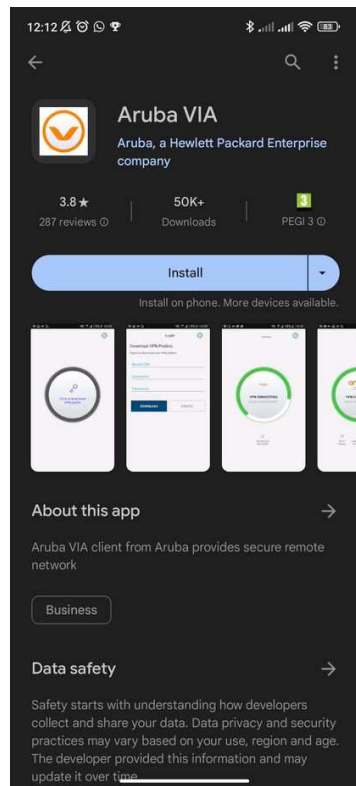
Aruba VPN setup guide for Android Devices



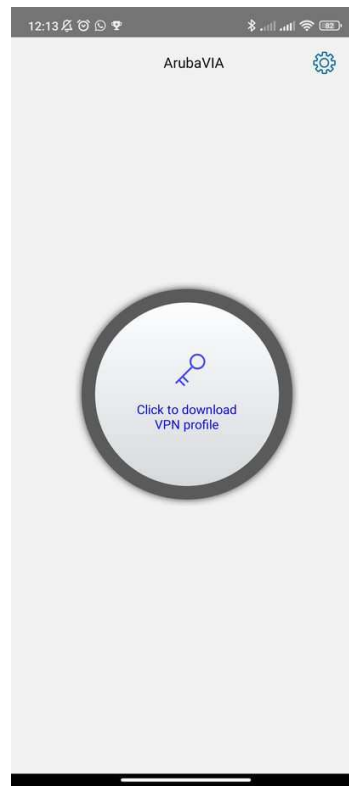
1. Navigate to the Google Play Store



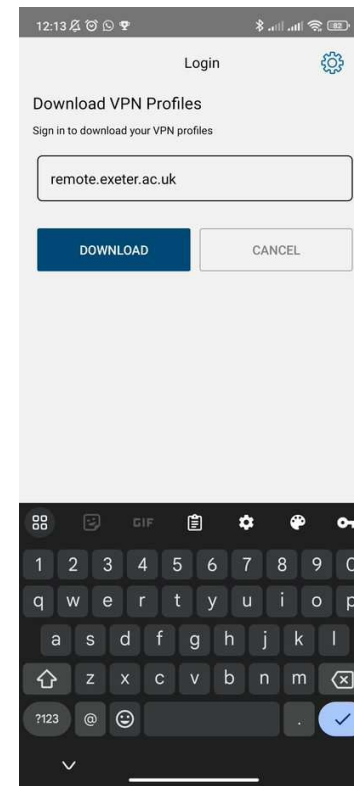
2. Search for Aruba VIA and click "install"



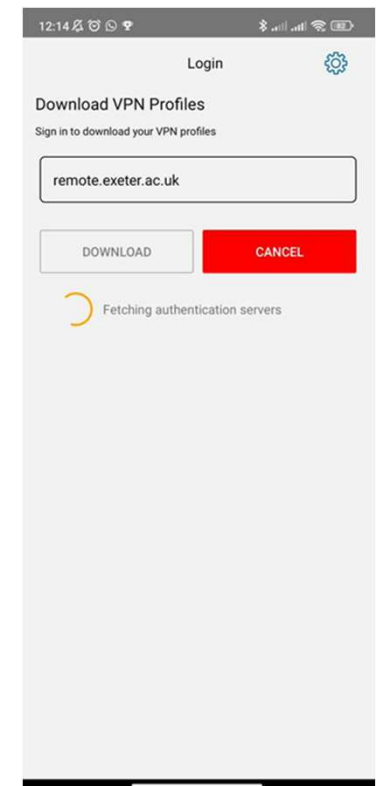
3. Open the Aruba VIA VPN software and press "click to download VPN profile"



4. Input "remote.exeter.ac.uk"



5. Click on "download" and wait for the app to connect to the authentication server

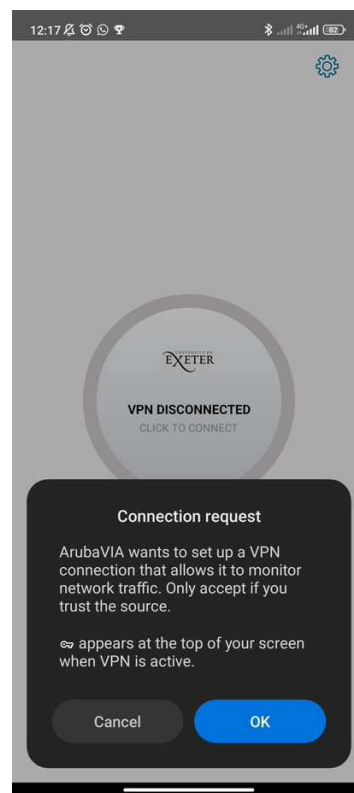
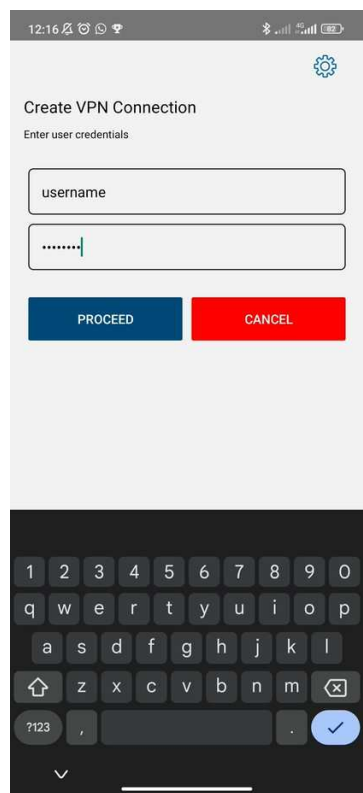
6. Input your UoE username and password. Then click on proceed.

7. Press on “Click to connect”

8. A dialogue box will open – Click on “Ok”

9. Your MFA Authenticator app send a notification Click on “Approve”

10. You should then be presented with a Green circle saying “VPN connected”



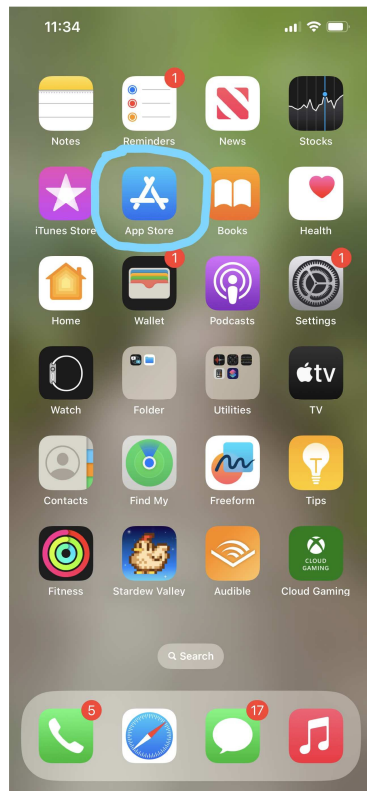

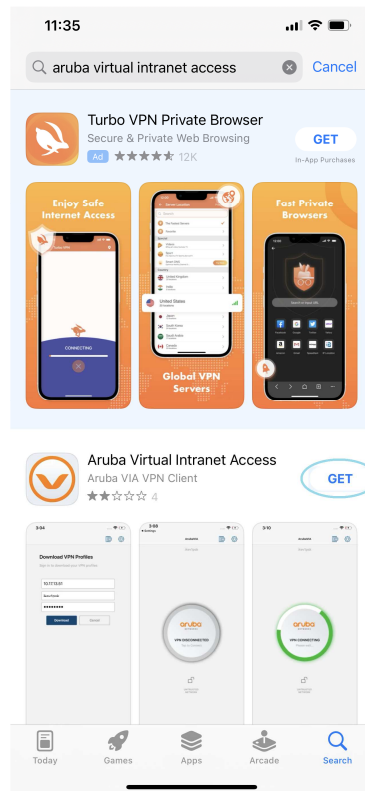
Aruba VPN setup guide for Apple iOS Devices



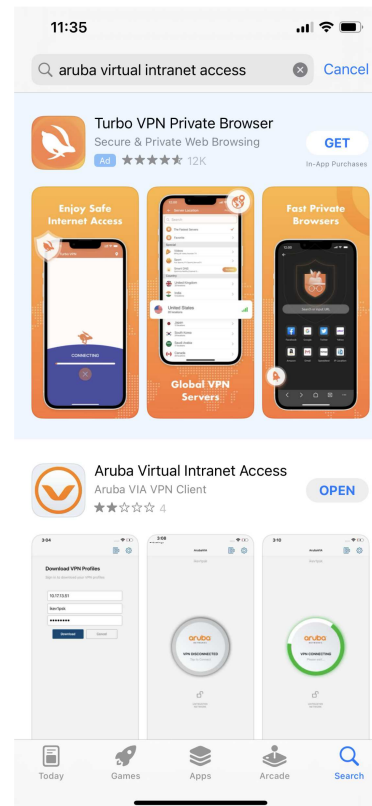
1. Navigate to the “App Store”



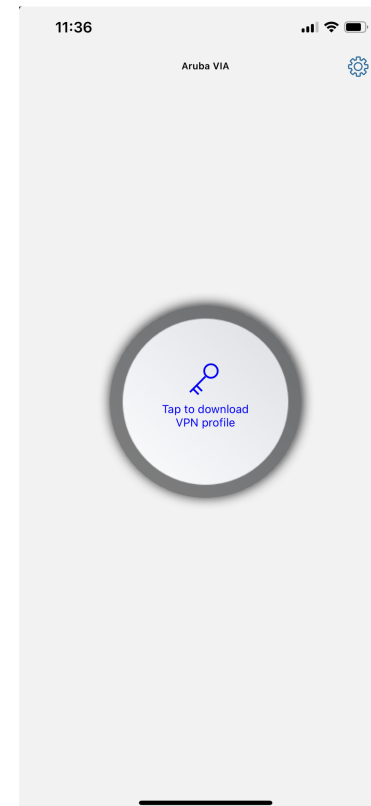
2. Search for “Aruba virtual intranet” and click on “Get”



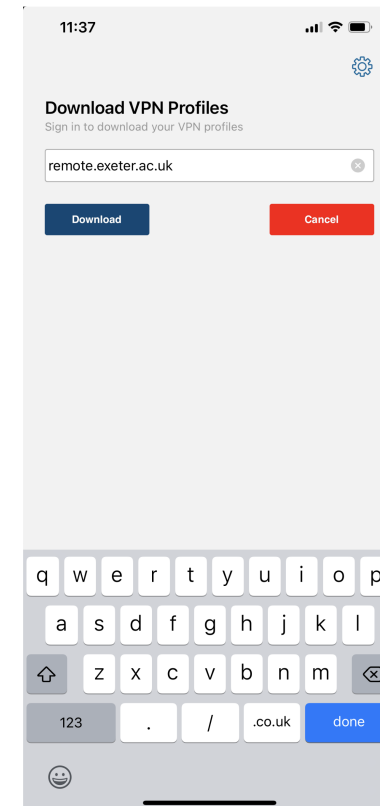
3. Once it is installed you can click on “Open”



4. Click on “Tap to download VPN profile”



5. Input “remote.exeter.ac.uk” into the box and click on “Download”





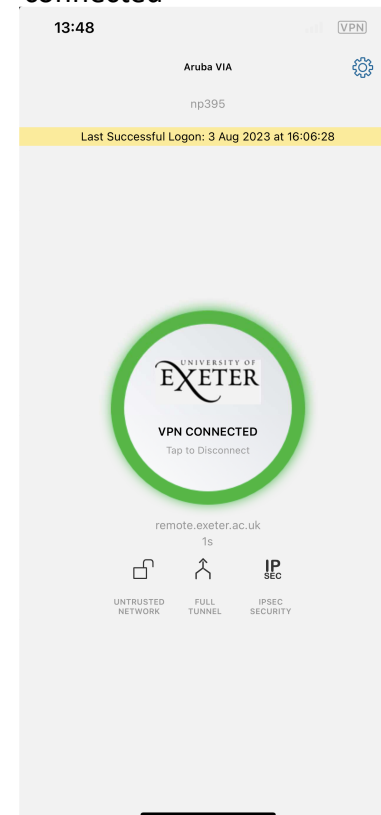
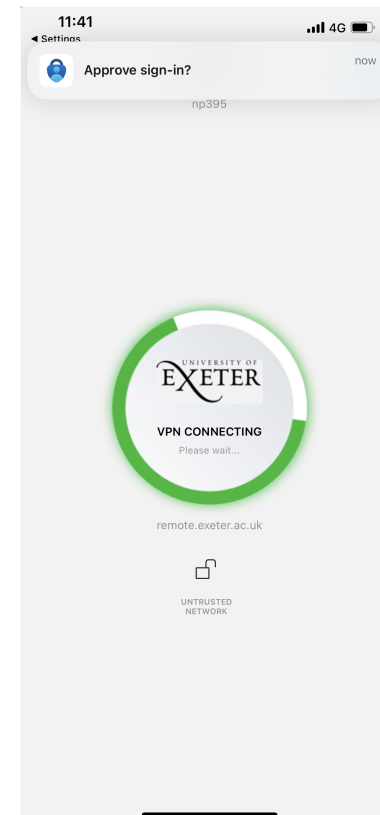
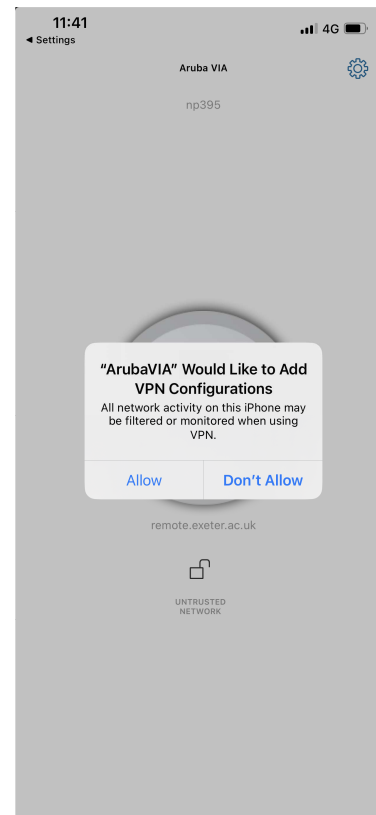
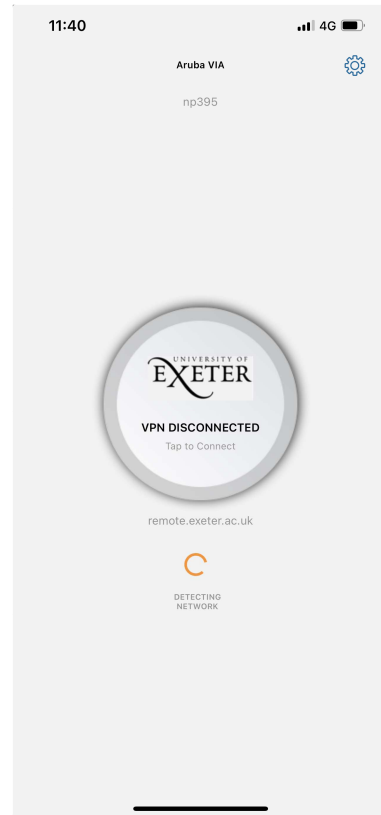
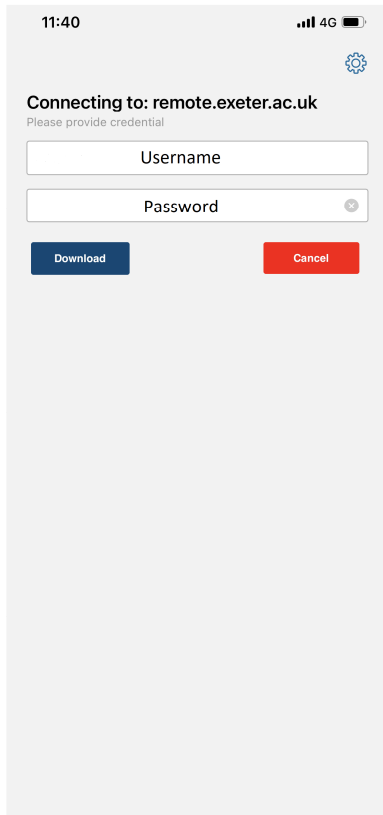
6. Type in your UOE username and password.

7. Press on the round circle to connect.

8. A dialogue box will open – Click on “Allow”

9. Your MFA Authenticator app send a notification Click on “Approve”

10. You should then be presented with a Green circle saying "VPN connected"

Key Tips:

❖ You only need to use VPN/MFA if you are accessing Trent/ESS off campus. If accessing on campus on a wired network or over Eduroam it will work in the same way it does currently.

❖ If accessing on Campus be sure to either be connected via a wired connection into an Ethernet port or connected to Eduroam Guidance on how to connect can be found here <https://www.exeter.ac.uk/departments/it/howdoi/wifi/>

❖ When setting up MFA you will need access to a PC as well as a smartphone. If you don't have access to a PC one can be booked on Campus;
